Current Situation


- •Foreign Visitors to Japan 2009: approx 6.8 mil. people → 2018: approx 31.2万mil. people 2018 tourism expenditure: 4.5189 trillion yen (153,000 per person)
- Foreign Residents: <u>approx 2.1 million in 2009</u> → <u>approx 2.6 million in 2018</u>
- •Status of Residence: Permanent Resident/Special PR↓:41% Exchange↑:12% Technical Intern↑:12% Engineer/Specialist in Humanities/International Services ↑:8%
- Foreign Laborers: <u>approx 560,000 in 2009</u> **→** <u>approx 1, 460,000 in 2018</u>

[Issues] Serious labor shortage as a result of falling population, school truancy of foreign children and students.







4. Surveys & Questionnaires: Foreign Residents Questionnaire

(1) The Foreign Resident Questionnaire carried out jointly by Fukushima Prefecture and Fukushima City.

[Implementation] From the end of October to November 15th 2019

[Process] Sent out randomly to citizens over the age of 20

384 residents (\times 2,800 residents across the whole prefecture)

※Questionnaire sheet translated into Chinese, English, Korean and Vietnamese in correspondence with the recipient's nationality

[Questions] As shown in complimentary documents

- (2) Exchange Student Monitoring Survey
- XQuestion contents the same as above (1). Regarding the implantation period and detailed process, however, it is hereafter planned to cooperate with universities accepting students to implement the survey.
- (3) Survey of companies employing foreign nationals

XA door-to-door survey of businesses is currently under separate consideration.

5. The Multicultural City Fukushima Promotion Guidelines

For the purpose of the establishment of a draft of guidelines to promote 'A Multicultural Fukushima City' (as Promotion Guidelines below), an investigation will be carried out with the following included:

- (1) These guidelines are positioned as basic actionable guidelines for the purpose of implementing the 'Fukushima City Integrated Plan' (chapter 5, paragraph 8: promotion of regional internationalization).
- (2) The guidelines should respond to the sudden changes in internationalization, and should exceed in adaptability.
- (3) The guidelines should be conscious of project coordination with other internal divisions as well as their connection with the budget.

6. The Guide for Living in Fukushima City

- (1) Current Lifestyle Guidebook
 - *Please see attached documents as a reference
- (2) Increase Provided Languages
 - [Current 4 Languages] Japanese, English, Chinese, and Korean
 - [Additional 3 Languages] Vietnamese, Thai, and Indonesian will be added alongside the above languages.
- ≪Reference ≫ X Ranking of nationalities in Fukushima City by population (top 7 countries)
 - 1 China, 2 The Philippines, 3 Vietnam, 4 Korea, 5 Nepal, 6 Indonesia, 7 Thailand
- (3) Broadening of published contents

7. Other Issues

The 'Promotion Guidelines (Draft)' will be established with the following points in mind:

- (1) The ascertainment and sharing of information regarding the lifestyle conditions etc. of foreign residents.
- (2) The coordination and role allotment of related organizations and facilities.
- (3) Coordination and regulation with regards to the 'Fukushima City Integrated Plan' for the next period (from 2021).
