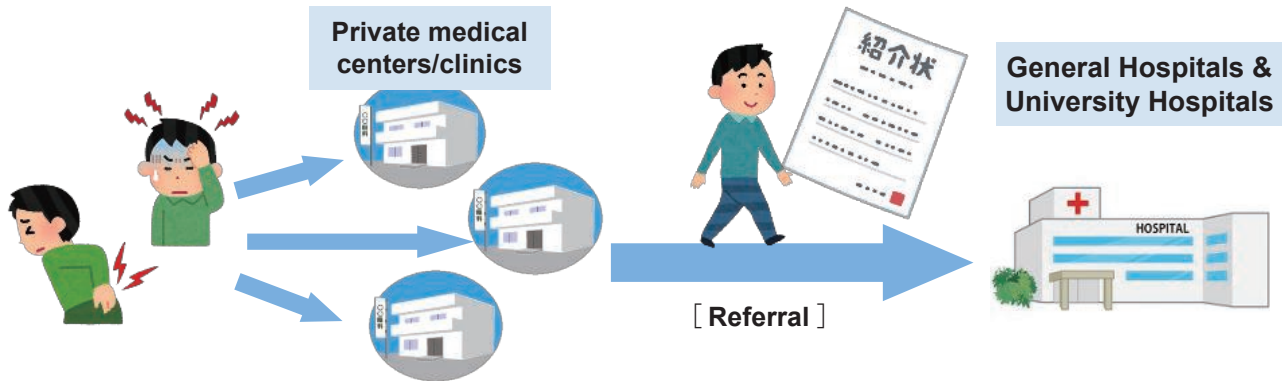


9-1 Going to a Hospital

Japan's medical facilities are separated into private medical centers/clinics and large hospitals such as general hospitals etc.

Hospitals are closed on Sundays and national holidays, and during the end-of-year and Obon holidays (around August 15th).



① Private Hospitals / Clinics

When you feel unwell or are injured, visit the medical center/clinic whose specialization is relevant to your symptoms.

You must bring your health insurance card (pg. 7).

During reception you will fill in a 'consultation form' (問診票 monshinhyo) so that the doctor can be aware of your physical condition.

② General Hospitals & University Hospitals

Large hospitals with all the facilities needed for operations, hospitalization, and further testing.

Obtain a referral from the medical center/clinic you regularly visit prior to visiting.

9-2 Medical Examinations

Those who are employed at a company etc., are able to receive health examinations through their workplace.

Those who are self-employed or are not working can undergo a 'citizens' health examination' (市民健診 shimin kenshin)
