


Asphalt was transported in containers such as pottery. In villages it was used a little at a time after being melted by being heated up on a sunken hearth in dwellings. Stone arrowheads and stone knives with asphalt on them were discovered at the Miyahata Site. Asphalt was used to attach stone arrowheads to arrows or to harden the strings with which the knives were tied. In other Jomon-period villages, asphalt was also used as a glue to repair pottery or as a color to paint the eyes of clay figures.




Asphalt used as a glue to mount stone arrowheads or hooks to handles.
